


Life Lessons

Matt 11:29-30

Dearest Friends:

The story of Mary and Martha can help you set your life in order. Jesus and His disciples arrived at the home of Lazarus, Mary and Martha about mealtime. It was Martha who invited them in. She [Martha] had a sister called Mary, who also sat at Jesus' feet and heard His Word. But Martha was distracted with much serving, and she approached Him and said, 'Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Therefore, tell her to help me.' And Jesus answered and said to her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things. But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken from her' (Luke 10:38-41)

What did Mary have that Martha needed? What was the "good part" Mary chose? Why will the good part that Mary chose remain hers forever?

If one were to read no further, one could assume Mary may have been a little lazy, leaving the needs of hospitality and hostess to her gregarious sister. "Don't Give Up-Go Through!"


"Pursue...overtake...and recover all." 1 Samuel 30:8

Dearest Friends:

When King David and his men returned home from battle, they discovered that the Amalekites had burned their homes to the ground and taken their families prisoner. They were devastated. They wept until they'd no tears left. Then God spoke to them and said, "Pursue...overtake...and... recover all." And with His help they did! So no matter how bad your situation looks right now, don't give up. Cry if you have to, then dry your tears and go out in God's strength and take back what the Enemy has stolen from you. If necessary, take it an inch at a time, drawing on His strength and not your own. Paul writes: "Let us not lose heart and grow weary and faint in acting nobly and doing right, for in due time and at the appointed season we shall reap, if we do not loosen and relax our courage and faint" (Gal 6:9 AMP). God won't quit on you, so don't quit on Him! He has promised in His Word: "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the Lord, your God" (Isa 43:2-3 NIV). Don't give up—go through! It's easy to quit, but it takes faith to go through. When your faith honors God, He honors your faith! And with Him on your side you'll come out stronger than you were when you went in.

Ever watch a lump of clay being transformed into something beautiful? The clay can't change itself; the power to do that lies in the hands of the potter. Isaiah says, "We are the clay, and you are the potter. We are all formed by your hand." That means you don't have to live the rest of your life with your phobias and hang-ups; God can change you. Even if you've been a worrier all your life, you don't have to worry for the rest of your life. So what if you were born in poverty or prejudice? You don't have to die that way. Where did you get the idea that you can't change? "Get Into God's Word"

"The Word became flesh and dwelt among us." (John 1:14 NKJV)

Dearest Friends:

Throughout the Old Testament God routinely spoke to people. In these thirty-nine books He gave them instructions, and promises with conditions. Some people understood what He was saying, others didn't. Some tried to live by it with varying degrees of success, while others rejected it and decided to do their own thing.

Then God did something truly incredible: "The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood. We saw the glory with our own eyes, the one-of-a-kind glory, like Father, like Son, generous inside and out, true from start to finish" (MSG) Jesus was a living Bible! John tells us, "The Word was God" (John 1:1 NKJV) so the more you get into the Word and get it into **you**, the more of God you're depositing within you.

You say, "But sometimes I don't get much out of reading the Bible." A word to the wise: When you start studying the Bible, don't do it to find some new truth nobody else has ever seen. Do it with the attitude, "Lord, what are You saying to *me*?" The problem most of us have isn't interpreting the difficult passages; it's obeying the ones we already understand!

The Word of God provides you with two things: (1) **Protection.** The Psalmist said, "Unless your law had been my delight, I would then have perished in my affliction. I will never forget Your precepts, for by them You have given me life" (Ps 119:92-93 NKJV). (2) **Direction.** "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (v. 105 NKJV).

Need direction? Need protection? Get into God's Word.

Dearest Friends:

One of Satan's favorite strategies is making you feel incapable of accomplishing anything worthwhile. He'll remind you of your past mistakes so that even when you do make an effort, your fear of failure will sabotage you. This is commonly referred to as "Failure Syndrome." Satan wants you to feel so bad about yourself that you'll have no confidence at all. But the fact is you don't need confidence in yourself—you need confidence in the God who lives within you! Without that, you're like a plane without fuel sitting on the runway; you look good but you've no power. Hear this: Through *Christ* you have the power to do what you never could on your own. Once you learn this truth, anytime the Devil tells you, "You can't do anything right," your response will be, "Maybe not, but Jesus in me *can*; and He *will* because I'm relying on Him and not myself. His Word says I'll succeed in everything I put my hand to" (See Jos 1:7). When the Enemy says to you: "You're not able to do this, so don't even try! You'll fail again like you did in the past," your response should be: "It's true; without Jesus I'm not able to do a single thing. But with Him, and in Him, I can do all I need to do."

Read these words, get them down into your heart and stand on them today: "I have strength for all things in Christ Who empowers me [I am ready for anything and equal to anything through Him Who infuses inner strength into me; I am self-sufficient in Christ's sufficiency]."

"Looking Good or Doing Good?"

"Jesus...went about doing good." Acts 10:38 (NKJV)

Dear Friends:

The Bible says, "God anointed Jesus...with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good." When you're led by God's Spirit, your focus won't be on *looking* good, but on *doing* good. You say, "But I'm so busy!" Nobody was busier than Jesus, yet He always responded to those in need. In Luke chapter 10 He tells of a Jewish traveler who was attacked by a gang and left to die by the road. First a Levite, then a priest ,passed by; however, each had important appointments to keep, so they didn't stop. Then a Samaritan came along. Now, he had every reason to look the other way, because the Jews and the Samaritans were long-standing enemies. Instead, "He...came where he was. And when he saw him, he had compassion" (*Luke 10:33 NKJV*).

Compassion will make you stop and rearrange your priorities. This Samaritan realized that where he was at that moment was more important than his next appointment. What would *you* have done that day?

Do you think you'd have acted like him? How about when God tries to interrupt your inflexible, tightly-organized, written-in-concrete schedule and asks you to make time for someone who's hurting? Are you willing to forgo your plans and do what He wants? If you're too busy to reach out to those who are hurting, you're too busy!

There's a story of a woman who was excited because Jesus had sent word that He was going to visit her that day. She cleaned, polished, cooked and prepared a table with the finest of foods. She had everything in it's proper place, because, after all, Jesus had picked HER to visit. This woman was so focused on making the right impression until she actually turned Jesus away three times because, instead of showing up with an entourage, He came needing her help. She didn't have time for the interruption, because she had to make a good impression. Looking good became more important than doing good.

Don't get so heavenly bound until you're no earthly good!
